Flood Damage & Recovery

As many of our neighbours and followers would be aware the club grounds were heavily impacted by flood waters on February 27th. Luckily we were able to get all of the horses to safety on the hill where we kept them contained in temporary yards, with some of our members 'camping' on site to keep watch overnight.

Fortunately, the water receded during the night and our members along with volunteers Malcolm and Carmen put in a huge effort to re-fence and return the horses to 'interim' paddocks mid afternoon on the 28th. Thanks also to Councillor Cath Tonks for visiting us, organising volunteers and bringing coffee!

Sadly the damage to the grounds and our buildings was significant. Four of our small feed sheds were destroyed, our clubhouse and toilets were flooded and our round yard was moved around 20 metres with most of the sand from it washed away. The most devastating outcome was the 'tearing up' of our recently extended and fully re-surfaced riding arena (only completed in September 2021). The club had secured a grant for it's redevelopment and we are hopeful we may be able to access some disaster relief assistance to repair it to it's former glory.

We held a Working Bee on March 5th with members & volunteers rallying once again to clean out the clubhouse and toilets, repair more fences, remove debris from the grounds and collect items that had been carried downstream to neighbouring properties. Massive thanks to volunteers Luke & James Palmer who joined us for the day, Cath Tonks for her ongoing support, Kellie from Whole Latte Love (coffee van) who was generously visiting many local places impacted by the floods and providing free coffee fixes for the workers.

Whilst it's been quite a harrowing ordeal for our horses and members it has bought us closer together and we are grateful for the support of so many others who have jumped in to help us out as well.
